## 1. BASIS

In this unit, the pupils will study the population of Spain and Europe. To do this, they will observe the evolution of Spain's population over the past years, will study concepts like the birth and death rate, migrations, etc., and will study statistics concerning Spain; the distribution of the population and the classification of the population in relation to age and work. They will also study contents related to Europe's population and their characteristics.

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## 2. METHODOLOGY

As pupils study this unit, they will gain better understanding of how we study population and how it's calculated. They will learn about Spain's population and how it is distributed and will represent it on graphs. They will learn about the European population and how to work with real data on population.
