1. BASIS

The contents and activities in this unit focus on Spain's territorial and political organisation. We will start by locating Spain in relation to the rest of the world; we will study the city council's role in a municipality. We will identify the bodies that form Spain's government and learn how municipal and autonomous governments work and their political and economic organisation. The pupils will establish similarities and differences between the institutions that form the Spanish and the autonomous communities' governments.



2. METHODOLOGY

In this unit, the pupils will gain a better understanding of Spain's composition and territorial organisation, they will be able to explain the importance of the Constitution and its role and explain the State's branches of government. They will know the institutions that form part of the government and their functions; they will recognise the existence of people's duties and rights, and value Spain's cultural, social and political diversity.
